Kitchen Spring Cleaning Made Easy

Get a jump on spring cleaning with these five hacks

Despite the cool temperatures that continue to prevail, March inevitably turns Okanagan resident's fancy to thoughts of spring. Why not get an early head start on your spring cleaning by working smarter rather than harder? Here are five tricks to make cleaning your kitchen a breeze:

1) Shiny sink

If your sink has lost its lustre, try sprinkling baking soda evenly across the surface. Then scrub with an old toothbrush or sponge. Before you know it your sink will shine again.

2) Burnt pots and pans

It's so easy to overlook food cooking on your stove just long enough to produce stubborn burn stains in frying pans or pots. No amount of scrubbing can get those stains out but here's a trick that will help: Fill the pot or pan with water and add two cups of white vinegar, bringing the solution to a boil. Then add two tablespoons of baking soda and scrub the stain away.

3) Clean cabinets

Make your greasy cabinets look like new with this solution: a teaspoon of dish soap, two tablespoons of baking soda and a cup of laundry detergent added to water.

4) Fight oil with oil

Believe it or not, the best way to get rid of the oil build up on the stove hood fan is to use oil itself. A couple drops of mineral or vegetable oil on a paper towel will remove the built up gunk like a charm and leave the surface shiny and more resistant to future stains.

5) Ring stains

Become the lord of the ring stains in your kitchen. Cover the stains on your counter or table with an old tea towel and then use your iron on the coolest setting with the steam turned off. Watch the ring disappear when you run the iron over it.
